Class 1

Mixed Intro Dressage, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count. TWO team members to ride Intro A (2008) TWO team members to ride Intro B (2009)

Class 2

Individual Intro Dressage – Intro A (2008) this class is not open to any rider/horse combination that has entered this test in Class 1

Class 3

Individual Intro Dressage – Intro B (2009) this class is not open to any rider/horse combination that has entered this test in Class 1

Class 4

Individual Combined Training - Intro C plus 60cms Show Jumping

Class 5

Mixed Prelim Dressage, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count. TWO team members to ride Prelim 14 (2006)

TWO team members to ride Prelim 18 (2002)

Class 6

Individual Prelim Dressage – Prelim 14 (2006). This class is not open to any rider/horse combination that has entered this test in Class 5.

Class 7

Individual Prelim Dressage – Prelim 18 (2002). This class is not open to any rider/horse combination that has entered this test in Class 5.

Class 8

Individual Combined Training Prelim 12 plus 70cms Show Jumping

Class 9

Mixed Novice Dressage, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count.

TWO team members to ride Novice 27 (2007)

TWO team members to ride Novice 30 (2006)

Class 10

Individual Novice Dressage – Novice 27 (2007). This class is not open to any rider/horse combination that has entered this test in class 9.

Class 11

Individual Novice Dressage – Novice 30 (2006). This class is not open to any rider/horse combination that has entered this test in Class 9.

Class 12

Individual Elementary Dressage – Elementary 43 (2006).

Class 13

Individual Medium Dressage - Medium 61 (2002)

Class 14

Mixed Team Riding Test, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count.

TWO team Riders to ride Prelim 2 (2016) and

TWO team Riders to ride Novice 24 (2010).

No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 15

Individual Prelim Riding Test – Prelim 2 (2016). This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden Prelim Riding Test in Class 14.

Class 16

Senior Individual Novice Riding Test – Novice 24 (2010). This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden Novice Riding Test in Class 14.

Combined Training – Notes

Classes 4 & 8 – Individual competition only, Dressage scores will be converted to penalties, first round jumping penalties will be added to dressage score for final score.

All competitors will be included in the individual SJ classes, any member who is part of a team in 70cms show jumping, should be marked clearly on entry form.

Show Jumping

All classes will be single phase.

Class 17

60cms Individual Show Jumping

Class 18

Mixed Team 70 cm Show Jumping, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count. No rider/horse combination can ride twice the same team.

Class 19

Individual 70 cm Show Jumping. This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden in Class 18.

Class 20

Mixed Team 80 cm Show Jumping, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count. No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 21

Individual 80 cm Show Jumping. This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden in Class 20.

Class 22

Mixed Team 90 cm Show Jumping, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count. No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 23

Individual 90 cm Show Jumping. This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden in Class 22.

Class 24

Mixed Team 100 cm Show Jumping, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count. No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 25

Individual 100 cm Show Jumping. This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden in Class 24

Class 26

Mixed Team Style Jumping, for teams of 3 or 4 riders with 3 scores to count.

TWO team members to jump 75 cm and

TWO team members to jump 85 cm.

No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 27

Individual 75 cm Style Jumping. This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden in the 75 cm section in Class 26.

Class 28

Individual 85 cm Style Jumping. This class is not open to any rider/horse combination who has ridden in the 85 cm section in Class 26.

Style Jumping 85cms Team/Individual classes are a Blair Castle Qualifier – There is no extra fee and anyone not wishing to be considered in qualifying may opt out.

Entry Fees – All entry fees are per individual member Dressage & Show Jumping Classes - £15 Combined Training Classes - £20 Withdrawals up to the closing date will be refunded. More information in notes section.

SCHEDULE – 2nd June 2024

It is each clubs responsibility to ensure they have completed the Prelim entries in time and that their members meet the eligibility criteria and flu vaccinations are correct.

Class 1a NQ Mixed Team HT 100 cm. 1b Q Mixed Team HT 100Cms

Teams of 3 or 4 members with 3 scores to count. BE100 Dressage 101 (2009)

No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 2a Individual NQ or 2b Individual Q HT 100cms

This class is not open to any rider/horse combination entered in Class 1a/b. Test to be ridden BE100 Dressage 101 (2009)

Class 3a Mixed Team Horse Trials 90 cm

Teams of 3 or 4 members with 3 scores to count. Team Members to ride BE Dressage 95 (2012).

No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 3b Junior or Senior Team Qualifying 90cms

Teams of 3 or 4 either Junior or Senior members, 3 scores to count.

Test to be ridden BE Dresage 95 (2012)

Class 4a NQ Individual or 4b Q IndividualHorse Trials 90 cms.

This class is not open to any rider/horse combination entered in Class 3a/b. Test to be ridden BE Dressage 95 (2012)

Class 5a Mixed Team Horse Trials 80 cms.

Teams of 3 or 4 members with 3 scores to count. Test to be ridden BE90 Dressage 92 (2009).

No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 5b Junior or Senior Team Qualifying 80 cms

Teams of 3 or 4 either Junior or Senior members, 3 scores to count.

Test to be ridden BE Dresage 92 (2009)

Class 6 a NQ Individual or 6b Q Individual Horse Trials 80 cm

This class is not open to any rider/horse combination entered in Class 5a/b. Test to be ridden BE90 Dressage 91 (2009).

Class 7 a NQ Mixed Team HT or 7b Q Mixed Teams 70cm

Teams of 3 or 4 members with 3 scores to count. Team Members to ride BE Dressage 91 (2009)

No rider/horse combination can ride twice in the same team.

Class 8a NQ Individual HT or 8b Q Individual HT 70 cm

This class is not open to any rider/horse combination entered in Class 7a/b. Test to be ridden BE Dressage 91 (2009)

Mixed Teams may be any combination of Junior & Senior members or Junior/ Senior Teams

NOTES.

- All rules relating to each discipline can be found in the 2024 British Riding Clubs Official Rule Book with the exception of any rules herein referred to.
- Entries to be submitted via the spreadsheet sent with entry form that will be emailed to all Clubs and payment made by BACS.
- Closing date is 10th May 2024 and no intimation of entries by email will be accepted.
- Late entries will only be accepted if space permits and will incur a late entry fee of £20 per individual. This rule will be strictly adhered to as there are a limited number of entries for the Cross Country.
- All entrants must be paid up registered members with BRC HQ a minimum of 7 days prior to competition
- Flu vaccinations must be up to date as per 2024 Rule Book
- All Qualifying HT entries will be required to hand their passports in via Team Manager to have flu Vaccinations checked
- Non Qualifying entries may be spot checked .
- If you don't have your flu vaccination certificate with you, you will be turned away from the competition which could result in the elimination of your team.
- Team managers are encouraged to check flu vaccinations are up to date prior to entering.
- All care will be taken to ensure that times allocated are reasonable if taking part in more than one discipline. It is the Club's responsibility to ensure that any clashes are resolved 7 days prior to the date of the Championships.

AS THIS IS A MULTI DISCIPLINE COMPETITION AND IF YOU ARE RIDING MORE THAN ONE HORSE WHICH RESULTS IN UNAVOIDABLE TIME CLASHES, THEN IT WILL BE UP TO INDIVIDUAL COMPETITORS TO DECIDE ON WHICH CLASS THEY WILL COMPETE IN.

Please note that changes to times will not be allowed just because the time is inconvenient to the rider!

- If a horse or rider has to withdraw through injury or illness and a replacement is required, it must be a direct swap into the same class.
- Competitors who are also taking part in the Horse Trials on the Sunday should be restricted to what classes they can compete in on the Saturday. Team Managers are responsible to ensure competitors are not entered in an unhealthy number of classes.
- Horses may enter more than one level of Dressage as long as it is consecutive levels, i.e., Intro & Prelim, Novice & Elementary. Horses are not allowed to enter both levels of Riding Test, irrespective of rider.
 - Horses may enter more than one level of Show Jumping as long as it is consecutive heights, i.e., 70cm & 80cm, 90cm & 100cm. Horses are not allowed to enter both heights of Style Jumping, irrespective of rider.

- Whips are allowed for the dressage, riding test classes and Horse Trials dressage. All whips for Show Jumping and Cross Country must be as per BRC rules
- Commanders are allowed for Dressage on Saturday
- Refund Policy after entries close. If there is a genuine reason for horse or rider having to withdraw after the closing date and before start of competition (31st May) due to illness or veterinary diagnosis, then the rider must present a doctor's certificate or a veterinary certificate detailing the reason why the withdrawal had to be made. In the case of a refund being made a 25% administration fee will be deducted from the entry fee.

Refunds will be made to the Club and not the individual.

- There will be no tack steward for the dressage and show jumping classes, but tack will be visually checked for the XC. It is the responsibility of the rider and their Team Manager to ensure that riders and horses have the correct tack. All hats MUST be visibly tagged. (Hot Pink)
- All hats must be tagged in accordance with BRC rules and for XC, back protectors
 must be worn. Sleeved tops are required, and sleeveless tops are not permitted. It is
 up to the individual competitor to ensure that all tack and equipment is up to
 standard as organisers will not be held responsible for injury resulting from
 defective equipment or equipment not up to current standards.
- Back Protectors must be to current standard BETA Blue 2018 Level 3
- Numbers will be available to be printed from Live Scoring. Number Bibs should be worn for all phases on both days.
- The Secretary will only deal with Team Managers and no individual rider so if you
 have a matter you wish to discuss please speak to your Team Manager. A copy of
 guidelines for Team Manager's will be sent. Clubs are responsible for ensuring their
 competitors know who their Team Manager is. Please ensure that all your
 members know that the Secretary will not deal with individual riders..
- Any objection must be lodged with a £50 deposit with the Secretary and if objection upheld, deposit will be returned.
- Stabling will be open from 3 pm on Friday 31st May. Friday night stables only must be vacated by 2.00 pm and entry for Saturday night stables not available before 3.00 pm.
- Cost of stabling £60/first night or only night and £30 for subsequent nights. There are ample stables on site. Please note that once stables are booked, no refund will be made as we are charged for the number of stables ordered.
- It is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that they notify the organisers of any stable changes.
- Only straw will be provided, anyone wishing to use shavings must bring their
- Should anyone require stabling on Thursday or Sunday night please contact the organisers

- It is a condition of the entry that all Clubs provide helpers. We appreciate that for smaller clubs and those travelling long distances this is not always practicable but any offer of help, even between classes is greatly appreciated.
- All dogs must be kept on short leads <u>at all times</u>. Extendable and retractable leads for dogs are banned from use at the venue. Owners of loose dogs will be fined the sum of £50 on the spot.
- Please ensure that all dog litter is picked up and this includes the Stable area.
- Please ensure that children are supervised at all time
- Please dispose of all litter in the bins/skip provided. Do not put broken tents/chairs etc in the skip **Take them home to dispose off**

Balloting policy (if required)

In the event of an over subscription of entries then the following balloting system will be put in place:

- Every Club will have the opportunity to ensure that they have at least one team in each discipline. In the event of a club not being able to field a full team then that club will be allowed 2 individuals representing them in each discipline. This is subject to Clubs fulfilling the criteria of having nominated volunteers to help at the Championships.
- If after the first ballot there is still capacity for further entries then all team names will be placed in a ballot box and drawn in order to fill the remaining team places. All other teams will be placed on a wait list.
- If space still permits, then individual entries will be accepted.
